- A member of one of the groups renting space at St. John's, a qualified welder, has volunteered to repair free of charge the numerous black and silver church chairs that have been broken. The repairs have been completed and the chairs are back. Session will be conveying its heartfelt thanks to this person.
- By the time you read this
 Chronicle the congregation
 will know the contents of the
 report from Presbytery on the
 February 22, 2018 visitation to
 St. John's. Any questions you
 might have relating to the
 report can be fielded by any of
 the elders or the Clerk of
 Session. For any of you who
 may have heard the rumors:
 No, Presbytery is not taking
 over St. John's with the

possibility of closing the church; and No, the Minister is not being asked to leave. A further special summer *Chronicle* dealing with this report and some other congregational issues will likely be forthcoming.

- A number of requests to rent space at St. John's were dealt with by Session. There is a great deal of ongoing interest from community groups in renting space at St. John's.
- The Lunch Hut has kindly offered to pay the church hydro bill for two months out of Lunch Hut proceeds.
- Our church elevator shaft will be resealed in the near future. Fortunately, it is being done under warranty. But, before that happens the shaft needs to have accumulated water pumped out. Is anyone in the congregation familiar with how this has been done in the past? If so, please speak to the Minister or the Clerk.
- Plans for the St. John's Vacation Bible Camp are well under way. It will be held from

- July 30th to August 1st at the church. Organizer, Lynn Oger (Phone: 604-538-2436), can be contacted with offers of assistance. The Legacy Trust Fund, as was the case last year, will again be providing some assistance to the camp this year.
- Session has agreed that St.
 John's will assist Holy Trinity
 Anglican Church White Rock
 in their sponsorship of a
 Syrian refugee family that is
 now in Canada. Further
 information will be contained
 in our church bulletins.
- Once again, <u>Session is</u>
 <u>appealing for volunteers from</u>
 <u>the congregation to count the</u>
 <u>Sunday offerings.</u> Training will be provided.
- The church Legacy Trust
 Committee met on June 8th.
 The committee Trustees are
 Emily Wilson (Chair), Dave
 Beale, Ted Andrew, Denise
 Langley, Lesley Leishman,
 and Jack Kergan. Roy Strang
 recently resigned due to his
 move to Vancouver. The fund
 currently has in excess of
 \$500,000. Income from the
 fund is distributed under strict
 guidelines approved by the
 congregation. This year, in

- addition to the church Vacation Bible Camp, assistance from the Trust will also help 9 children attend Camp Douglas this summer. A sum of \$1,000 has also been given to the Zimbabwe Gecko Society.
- A church cleaning bee took place on Saturday, July 14th. The hot weather failed to deter volunteers from St. John's and W.R. Lutheran from accomplishing much and enjoying good fellowship.
- The regular meeting of the Presbytery of Westminster took place on June 19th and from feedback from our St. John's representative, Emily Wilson, much was accomplished. Emily advises that reports on the recent General Assembly deliberations will be displayed in the church hall for perusal.
- As you enjoy summer, please continue to pray for St. John's, our Minister and church family, that we will enter the fall rested, rejuvenated and refocused.
