Help them to navigate the website, sharing with them how they should scroll down to live video feed, click on the tab which will redirect you to the live service.

As I have previously mentioned, we would like to call upon all to keep regularly in touch with others checking in through emails, phone calls and video calls. Some people, previously unknown to us, have called to church asking to please pray for them and to ask if we would consider keeping in touch with them during this these times by giving them a regular call. There are so many people out there that are not just feeling lonely, but who are indeed lonely. Maybe you do know about someone who may be challenged with loneliness, please give them a call. On Remembrance Day we say, "Lest We Forget", and I do believe that the whole world today is called not to forget God and our neighbours. Deuteronomy 4:7 – 9 says: "7 What other nation is so great as to have their gods near them the way the LORD our God is near us whenever we pray to him? 8 And what other nation is so great as to have such righteous decrees and laws as this body of laws I am setting before you today? 9 Only be careful and watch yourselves closely so that you do not forget the things your eyes have seen or let them fade from your heart as long as you live. Teach them to your children and to their children after them - "Lest We Forget".

Session/elders will keep regularly in touch with you, as well as other members who have offered themselves helping to call people. Some people have signed up to help deliver groceries to those who are in self-quarantine or those seniors who don't feel comfortable engaging in public spaces at the moment. Please contact Rev. At this stage all activities are suspended indefinite, but regular worship services will continue using the electronic media, streaming the Sunday Worship Service live on the Internet. If you know people that don't have Internet, you could also tell them that we also broadcast live on FM 89.3. As said earlier, we are looking for new ways we can serve you. The church will stay open for any questions and serve as a way to keep in contact with you.

Thank you for mailing your offerings to the church or dropping it through the mail slot at the door next to the Memorial Garden.

Once again, thank you for your understanding and pray that we all will be back at Church soon. Please pray with your Session that the will of God will be done and that He will protect and heal our people from this disease. As church of Jesus Christ, the Body of Christ, we shall rise and continue to embody the love, compassion and grace of our Lord to those

who are most vulnerable around us. May God's patience, strength and peace guide us all as we journey through these uncharted waters together. May the peace of God be with you.
