The world continues to be horrified by images of death and destruction coming out of Ukraine, a catastrophe we have not witnessed in Europe since the Second World War. The needs are desperate and today a 30-bed Emergency Field Hospital flew to the region on the Samaritan's Purse DC-8 cargo plane.

The hospital can serve 100 patients a day and has an ICU, emergency room, pharmacy, and operating theater where we can perform up to 10 surgeries daily. Many civilian deaths and injuries have been reported already, and casualties are expected to increase as the fighting rages.

Additional Canadian Disaster Assistance Response Team (DART) members—including medical and logistics personnel—will join our staff already helping some of the more than 1 million refugees who've fled the carnage to neighboring countries. Two outpatient health clinics—equipped to treat 200 patients a day—will arrive on an additional flight. Throughout this response we will continue to work with our more than 3,200 church partners in Ukraine, many of which were distributing Operation Christmas Child shoeboxes as conflict erupted.

The most important thing we can do is pray. Please pray earnestly for the people of Ukraine and that God will soon bring peace. Now is the time to remember what Jesus told us: **"These things I have spoken to you, that in Me you may have peace. In the world you will have tribulation; but be of good cheer, I have overcome the world"** (John 16:33).
